

Welcome to our list of plants that we recommend for attracting pollinators of all types! This is not a comprehensive list of everything we carry, rather, it is a selection of some of our favorites of what we carry this year:

Vanilla Spice Summersweet *Clethra alnifolia*



This fragrant sweet-smelling shrub will draw in pollinators of all types. Its nectaries are enjoyed by hummingbirds and butterflies. Deer aren't too fond of its foliage either! Vanilla Spice Summersweet is a selection from a native shrub.

Viking Chokeberry *Aronia melanocarpa*



This member of the rose family grows clusters of white flowers late spring that are prized by pollinators! Not only that—it produces Aronia berries that are said to be a super food that is high in antioxidants. This selection from a native plant also has beautiful red fall color!

PJM Rhododendron *Rhododendron x PJM*



A huge favorite of ours. Loved by bumblebees, this hybrid rhododendron has roots in American native rhododendrons. Its early bright purple blooms are a great resource for early spring pollen. Its evergreen foliage provide year round interest!

First Editions: Iceberg Alley Sageleaf Willow *Salix canadensis*



This silvery shrub produces brightly colored catkins that are covered in pollinators all spring! Its unique fuzzy grey foliage will be an attractive unique shrub loved by all!

Instant Karma Elderberry *Sambucus nigra*



This Variegated elderberry is a showstopper!!! Its lacy fragrant flowers are adored by bees that adore the nectar. The umbel of flowers is replaced with deep purple elderberries! This is a selection from an American native.

Baby Joe *Eupatorium maculatum*



This selection from a native variety produces beautiful magenta flowers that are loved by pollinators. Baby Joe is a smaller and more domesticated selection from Joe Pye. Baby Joe is an extremely durable plant that can handle tough sites with ease!

Coral Reef Bee Balm *Monarda didyma*



This Bee Balm produces clumps of uniquely colored coral flowers. It is loved by hummingbirds, butterflies and bees! The foliage produces a very pleasant spicy aroma. Deer and rabbits prefer to avoid this plant.
